McPherson County Board of Commissioners Minutes of Proceedings September 3rd, 2019

The McPherson County Board of Commissioners met in regular session on Tuesday, September 3rd, 2019 in the Commissioners chambers. Chairman Neuharth called the meeting to order at 9:00AM. OTHER MATTERS DISCUSSED AND ACTION TAKEN:

2020 Provisional Budget Hearing

At 9AM a hearing was held on the 2020 budget. Kunz move and Feickert seconded to increase line 101-212-424 from \$30,000 to \$52,000. All voted in favor. Motion carried. More discussion and budget adoption will take place on September 24th at 10AM.

Equalization Office

Director of Equalization Lanette Butler updated the board on the GIS project status and the zoning board ordinance update project. The board of commissioners will meet as the board of Adjustment on September 24th at 9AM. Butler along with State's Attorney Kallenberger and Hoffman briefly described the role of board of adjustment. The current zoning ordinance was discussed.

Feickert moved and Kunz seconded to have NECOG do a full rewrite of the zoning ordinance versus a partial rewrite. All voted in favor. Motion carried.

Resolution 19-8 was discussed. Any project under construction as of today that does not have the proper permits may be subject to additional fees. Butler stressed that property owners applying for building permits are the only way to keep the tax burden fair for all property owners and to keep county valuations accurate. A building permit must be obtained from the county director of equalization if the property is in rural McPherson county, Long Lake town, Wetonka, or Hillsview for any improvement with a value greater than \$3,000. Residents within the city limits of Eureka or Leola must obtain proper permits from their respective city offices.

Volunteer Fireman/EMT Rosters

Kunz moved and Feickert seconded to approve the presented lists of volunteers for the Eureka Fire Department, Eureka EMTs, Leola Fire Department, Leola EMTs and the Long Lake Fire Department. It is McPherson County's intent to cover these volunteers for workman's comp purposes and the rosters for all listed entities are on file in the Auditor's Office. All voted in favor. Motion carried.

Emergency Management

An electrical quote to get a working stove in the courthouse, needed to make the courthouse a viable shelter, was discussed. An additional quote was requested by the board. More discussion will be held in October.

Sheriff's Department

Sheriff Ackerman informed the board that the new sheriff's pickup is here and will be outfitted. The Walworth County Jail in Selby was discussed. Marion Schlomer, commissioner from Walworth County, will be to give a presentation on the jail during a special meeting on September 23rd at 7pm.

Surplus Property

Metzger move and Feickert to surplus the following equipment at the Schock Consignment Sale on September 21st in Leola, unsold items will be disposed of after the sale; 2 Sharp Calculators, 3 chairs, 3 large book steel shelving units, countertop stand, 3 small steel cabinets with shelves and files, steel office desk, typewriter stands, 7 incomplete antique brass door knob sets,

Drainage Board

At 10:30AM Kunz moved and Beilke seconded to meet as the McPherson County Drainage Commission. All voted in favor. Motion carried. The commission met concurrently with the Board of Commissioners and their minutes are listed in a separate section.

Highway Department

Metzger moved and Feickert seconded to surplus the following equipment at public auction on October $1^{\rm st}$ at 1PM at the Courthouse in Leola: 1998 International Truck model #2554

Spitzer updated the board on the schedule for hot mix, reseal, blading, culvert replacement, and mowing. The Highway department budget and equipment/supply needs through the end of 2019, concerns over the high cost of snow removal and the strain it has put on this year's budget were discussed.

Right of Way Permits

Metzger moved and Feickert seconded to approve the following right of way permits: ValleyTelco, to bore fiber cable between Section 10 and Section 3; Section 10 and Section 9 of T125-R68. ValleyTelco to bore fiber cable in Section 36 of T126-67W. All voted in favor. Motion carried.

VSO Officer – Darrell Pfeifle

Pfeifle asked the board to think about the future of the Veteran's Service Office should one of the officers retire. He shared with the board some available programs, software system and a brief overview of the items/number of veterans he is currently working with.
